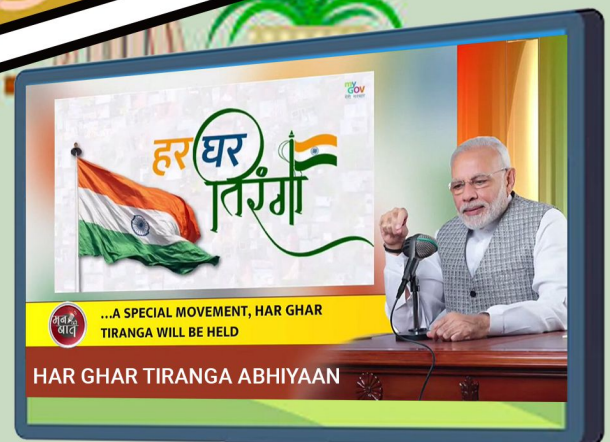

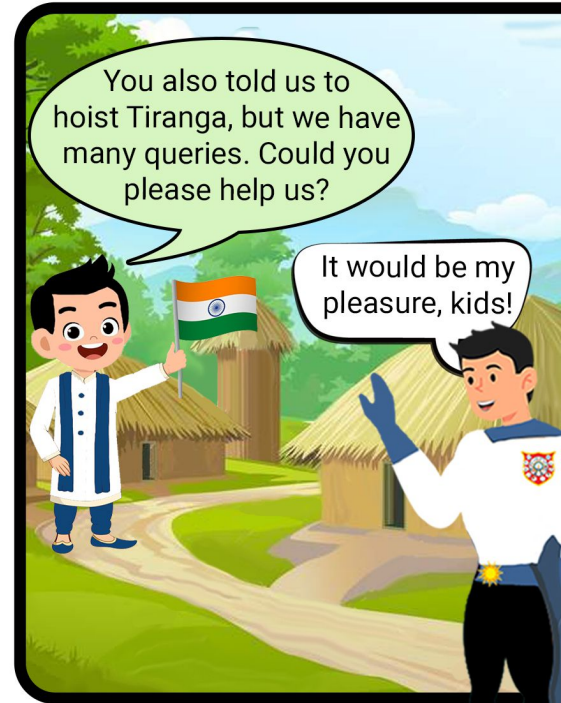

Okay, tell me now, what does three colors represent in our national flag?

We knew this 😊

The Saffron color depicts the courage & sacrifice

White color highlight the truth, peace & purity

The Green color refers to the prosperity

Non-violence, forgiveness, truth, shame, reverence, control of the senses, charity, sacrifice, austerity & meditation are the ten strenghts of Dharma.

You are intelligent kids. I hope you know that 'Ashoka Chakra' in our flag represents the Laws of Dharma.

Yes, Vaayu. We knew this. The Ashoka Chakra have 24 spokes that are uniformly spaced. The Ashoka Chakra is always marked in a Navy-blue on the white strip of the flag.

The flag is hoisted on Independence Day to commemorate our freedom.

We unfurled our flag on Republic Day to celebrate the date on which the Constitution of India came into effect.

Yes, Kids! The national flag code provides the instruction & guidance to ensure the National Flag of India is treated with dignity & fly high in its full glory.

# HOW TO HOIST A NATIONAL FLAG

The National Flag of India can be displayed in the open by individuals, organizations, or government authorities.

The Indian National Flag should be given a place of honor & be placed in a clean spot.

When flown in open, the Tiranga can be flown at any time of day or night.



The saffron band should be on top when the National Flag is hung flat & horizontally on a wall. When the National Flag is hung vertically, the saffron band should be to the left of a person looking at it.

When the National Flag is hung from a staff that sticks out horizontally or at an angle from a window sill, balcony, or the front of a building, the saffron band should be at the end of the staff that sticks out the farthest.

The National Flag should not be flown at half-mast unless the Government of India notifies. When the National Flag is at half-mast, it must first be raised to the top of the staff & then lowered to the half-mast position. Before taking down the flag for the day, it should be raised to its highest point again.



# THINGS TO AVOID WHILE HOISTING



The National Flag should not be hung upside down, with the saffron band on the bottom.



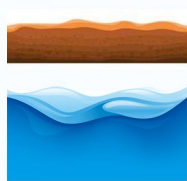
The National Flag should not be displayed if it is torn or dirty.



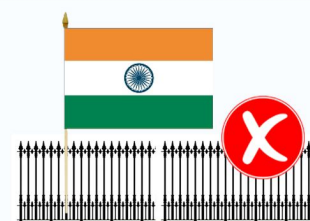
The National Flag shall not be dipped in salute to any person or thing



The National Flag may not be used as a festoon, rosette, bunting, or in any other way to decorate.



The National Flag shall not be allowed to touch the ground, floor, or trail in the water.



The National Flag must not be flown or attached in a way that it gets damaged.



The National Flag should not be flown simultaneously as any other flag from a single masthead.



The National Flag cannot be used to cover a speaker's desk, nor can it be draped over the platform.



# THINGS TO AVOID WHILE HOISTING



The National Flag cannot be used as a curtain for anything, not even at private funerals.



The National Flag will not have any writing on it.



The National Flag cannot be used to wrap, receive, or deliver things.



The National Flag cannot be used to cover a car's sides, back or top.



No other flag or bunting may be placed above, next to or higher than the National Flag. Also, nothing not even flowers or garlands, may be put on or above the flag mast from which the National Flag is flown.



No one can use the National Flag below the waist as part of a costume, uniform, or accessory of any kind. It also cannot be embroidered or printed on pillows, handkerchiefs, napkins, underwear, or any other dress material.





Kids, remember that the National Anthem will follow the Flag Salutation.

Kids, whoever intentionally prevents the singing of the Indian National Anthem

or causes disturbance to any assembly engaged in such singing will be imprisoned for a term which may extend to three years, or with a fine, or both.

Open the official portal of Har Ghar Tiranga Campaign at [harghartiranga.com](https://harghartiranga.com)

Pin a Flag on the portal. Adjust the location where the citizen wishes to pin the flag.

Once the flag is successfully pinned, the notification will appear on the screen displaying the success of the action.

The prompt shall also display the option to download the Certificate.

Tap on the option of Download Certificate. The certificate will open up on the screen.

To save the certificate offline as a png image, tap on Download.

## DIGNIFIED DISPOSAL OF A DAMAGED FLAG

### WAY 1



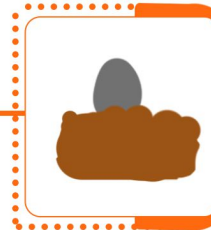
1 Find dignified wooden box



2 Fold the flag respectfully & place in box



3 Mark the burial location with stone marker



4 Bury the box in earth

### WAY 2



1 Build a fire



2 Fold the flag respectfully



3 Carefully place the folded flag on the top of fire



4 Take a moment to respect the flag

### WAY 3



Consider recycling of synthetic flag

### OUR FLAG, OUR PRIDE

Paper flag should not be thrown on the ground after the event. It should be disposed off with any above method.

If you see a national flag being disrespected, please collect it & dispose respectfully with dignity.







# CORRECT WAY TO FOLD TIRANGA



STEP-1



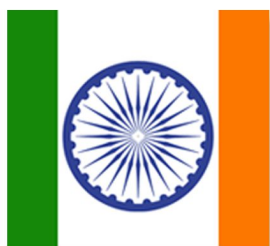
Place the flag horizontally

STEP-2



Fold the saffron & Green bands under the middle white band

STEP-3



Fold the white band in such a way that only the Ashoka Chakra is seen with parts of saffron & green bands

STEP-4



Carry the folded flag on palms or arms to store it

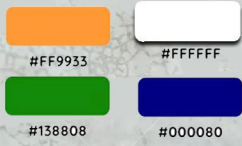

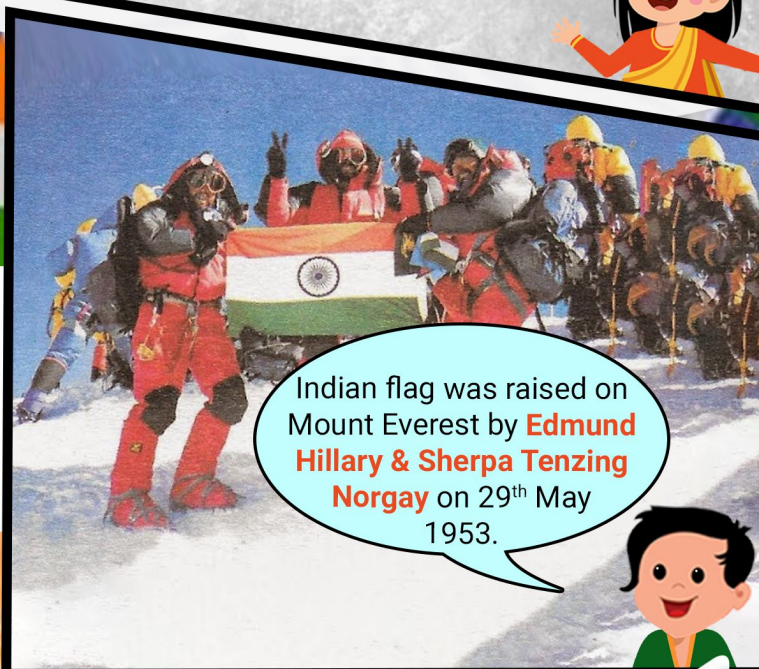
In April 1984, the Indian flag flew into space as an emblem on the spacesuit worn by Cosmonaut Wing Commander **Rakesh Sharma**.
